

We believe that there should be at least one fully developed evangelical Christian university among the 40 universities already within Australia. So, we're on a mission to establish a world-class Christian 'university college' that offers Certificate level awards through to Bachelor, Masters and Doctorate awards, and everything in-between, across all fields of study that any 'normal' world-class university would offer.











## THE STORY OF THE QUEENSLAND CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY LTD

(Currently not accredited)

Over 30 years ago, in 1987, a group of Christian educators witnessed the establishment of Bond University on the Gold Coast, Australia's first private university. These Christian visionaries then approached the State Government and Premier of the day, Sir Joh Bjelke-Petersen, about the idea of starting a similar private but Christian university.

With the permission of the Queensland Government authorities, and support of other Australian State Government Attorneys-General, "Queensland Christian University Ltd" (QCU) was legally incorporated and registered as a company.

Roland Heazlewood, a QCU Board Member for over 20 years, recounts that: "The next step was to introduce another act into Parliament granting the university authority to issue degrees from their educational programs."

Despite the fact that this next step didn't happened, the QCU company registration has been maintained with the resolute intent that it would become the university those early founders envisioned. Today, Universal Education and Training Ltd (UNET) is the ultimate holding company of Queensland Christian University

Ltd, and although QCU is still not accredited or registered as a university, it provides a legal entity and powerful constitutional company framework through which the ChristianUniversityforAustralia.org. au initiative can be fulfilled (subject to all Government registration requirements being met).

The emerging QCU Board functions in an advisory capacity contributing to the strategic development and realisation of the vision for this proposed world-class Christian tertiary institution.

UNET is a not-for-profit registered training organisation which has been delivering Government accredited training to adults since 2000. ChristianUniversityforAustralia.org.au is an initiative of UNET.

## TWELVE STRATEGIC DIMENSIONS

#### 1. Academic Programs

Preparing documentation for TEQSA to meet Australian Government requirements for the commencement of a new university.

Making information about the proposed university widely available to the Australian community and to overseas peoples.

#### 4. Christian Culture & Cornerstones

Working towards a university campus that is distinctive by its emphasis on Biblical principles and promotion of a Christian world-view.

#### **5. Corporate Structure & Governance**

Bringing together a cohesive team of Christian academics and administrators to develop policies and procedures consistent with those required of a world class multidisciplinary teaching and research university.

#### 6. Finance (Funding)

Seeking God's provision of funds needed for the establishment of the university and working as good stewards of capital and assets to achieve strategic goals.

#### 7. International Connections

Forming links with tertiary institutions and accreditations throughout the world to draw from their experience and expand our range of course and research options.

#### 8. Land, Infrastructure & Resources

Purchasing land and developing twenty first century learning spaces, equipped with the best technology, and supporting campus infrastructure.

#### 9. Management & Administration

Ensuring that the right personnel are in place and that all practical aspects of administering the institution are correctly addressed.

#### 10. Political Connection & Support

Making contact with all levels of government in order to meet requirements and benefit from educational support initiatives.


#### 11. Research Activities

Pursuing unique research opportunities that may be distinctly Australian in areas such as environmental studies, solar energy and engineering.

Bringing together Christian people from many diverse backgrounds to contribute their experience and expertise to the development of the university.







#### MAIN CAMPUS LOCATION

The Christian University for Australia initiative has the potential opportunity to design a campus on a relatively untouched parcel of land in the heart of the Sunshine Coast. This property has been in the Wises family for generations and is brimming with natural qualities in the form of native fauna and flora. Situated at the base of Buderim, the land creates a natural overland flow leading water from the hill out to the connecting waterways of Maroochydore.

Also of interest is the Maroochydore CBD Development located just over a kilometre away. The proximity of this major infrastructure development precinct only enhances the attractiveness of having a University Campus on Wises Road land.



#### INNER-CITY PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE

An inner-city campus facility could be included within the Maroochydore CBD Development and could possibly accommodate a multi-purpose Performing Arts Centre Facility.

We have been granted permission from Mueller College, Redcliffe, to use the plans for their existing 6 storey building which includes a 1500 seat tiered level performing arts centre auditorium, a library, a 200 seat cafeteria, and multi-purpose lecture rooms.

This building has the capacity to cater for 450 students on site in small class lectures at any one time, as well as 1500 attending mass lectures or functions and performances on site, and up to 10,000 distance students.

We believe that this state of the art facility will be of incredibly benefit to both the university students, and the surrounding community, in it's capacity and potential for learning and entertainment.



#### STUDENT RESIDENTIAL FACILITY

Christian Universities in America are a shining example of the power of community involvement in the holistic development and nurturing of the students through the student residential facilities.

We are passionate about creating not only an excellent learning environment for the students, but also ensuring that students are supported spiritually, mentally and emotionally through their tertiary journey.

It is yet to be determined the exact location of the student accommodation; whether it be included in the traditional multi-acre campus, the inner-city campus or at a campus of its own.

However, it is a priority that the student residential facility is designed with great intent and purpose to ensure the safety of each student, as well as provide every opportunity for the enrichment of student life and experience on campus.

DR RICARDO SIMEONI PhD, MAppScMedPhys, GCertMagResonTech, GDipT, *AppScPhys* 

Dr Ricardo Simeoni is a medical and theoretical atomic/quantum physicist. As a masters graduate in medical physics from QUT he was the first in his field to take up employment at the Royal Brisbane Hospital. During his time at the RBH Dr Simeoni worked in the Physical Sciences Department and was appointed as state-wide Coordinator of the Mammography Quality Assurance Program for Queensland Health and played a notable role in the program's natural on-going development. He went on to complete his PhD in physics at James Cook University in Townsville.

MILHAM-SCOTT PhD, GradDipEd, BSc(Hons), BSc


